



Airport survey

Council will undertake a passenger survey at Port Lincoln in the last week of November 2017. The survey will look at where passengers are from and the purpose of their trip. This year's survey will be compared to the 2008 and 2011 survey period.

Airport Business Plan review

Council has adopted an in-house model for the review of the Port Lincoln Airport Business Plan. The business planning for the Port Lincoln Airport complements the Master Plan, which was adopted in April 2016. The first meeting will be held in coming months with the new plan to be finalised by October 2018.

Support for speed limit reduction

Council resolved at its August meeting to support a request to reduce the speed limit on Sullivan Drive, Boston. Council received a request from the Point Boston community to reduce the speed limit to 80km/h along Sullivan Drive in view of particular concerns over the East Bay Road intersection. Council will notify DPTI of its view.

Entry sign competition winners selected

Council has chosen the winning entrants from its boundary/welcome sign competition, which attracted more than 20 submissions. The winner of the professional section is Barry Haynes and the winner of the amateur section is Jade Ballan-

the competition winners over the next few weeks before releasing the final designs. The winning entry for the professional category is likely to be chosen for Council's entry signs and the amateur category for the locality signs.

Airport car parking fees reviewed

Council has reviewed the structure of the Port Lincoln Airport car parking fees. At its meeting in August Council resolved that the implementation of a first four-hours-free parking facility at the Port Lincoln Airport main carpark commence from Monday, October 16, 2017. The charges will be based on the following fee structure, with the ongoing requirement for a ticket to be displayed at all times irrespective of the duration up to the maximum period of seven days (168 hours):

No changes to structure

Council has finished its Elector Representation Review, with no changes to be made. At its meeting in August, councillors resolved to:

- Retain area-wide councillors,
- Elect the mayor from within the elected councillors,
- Retain seven councillors, and;
- Retain the existing name for the Council.

Council also noted the 27 submissions received in the second round of consultation on the Representation Review Report.

Coles Pt staircase funding

Council has been successful in a 2017/18 Recreational Fishing Grant application for \$49,686 (excl. GST) to improve the stairway at Coles Point. The funds mean council can construct a series of platforms/viewing areas connected by stairs to replace the storm damaged section of timber-framed walkway removed during last September/October. Council's funding application for a fishing platform at Snapper Point, Coffin Bay, was unsuccessful.
