





CUMMINS HOSPITAL AUXILIARY 70 YEARS

Seventy years of the Auxiliary in the Cummins district, a time that has seen many changes to our health services and how we support them. In the past, members were very hands-on with making curtains, repairing linen and doing many jobs within the hospital. We were there to support Doctors and staff and to make patients stay as comfortable as possible.

The Auxiliary has always worked hard to raise money to support the hospital financially with various fundraisers. For quite a few years, we held a fete in the Cummins institute, where local SA CWA branches would each have a stall, and the money they raised went to the Auxiliary. There have been deb balls, baby competitions, bridal parades, and raffles, and for many years now, we have held a Melbourne Cup lunch. The lunches were first held in the Cummins Hotel and later in the Ramblers club rooms. Over the years, we have had various forms of entertainment at the lunches, including items, fashion parades, and competitions. These events have always been good fundraisers, and we have appreciated the support we have had from the community over the years. We have also held election day Trading Tables for many years, but Covid made that difficult for the recent elections.

Our commitment to the hospital, staff and doctors now is more in financial support, and we will continue with the Cup lunch, raffles and money boards whenever we can. We would encourage people to become involved in the auxiliary; it is a very rewarding organisation to belong to, and our community will always need our doctors, hospital, hostel and health services.









The last two months has seen our group sharing a meal at local hotels then planning our future activities. Some of our events need to be fund raising occasions as Zonta International has specific commitments and they ask all clubs world -wide to contribute towards the cost of these projects.

For example, Zonta provides health and wellbeing products and information to women and girls who are disadvantaged in many ways. The Birthing Kit project is one program that provides basic clean needs for women giving birth at home in unclean situations. Clubs have to purchase the products (soap, cord, scissors, plastic sheet etc.) and package them. This year we have \$1000 for this project. More information will be provided later so that friends can help with the packing.

However, locally Zonta LE provided ten \$50 vouchers, for Drakes' super market, to be given to disadvantaged women who are staying at Yarredi Women's Shelter, Port Lincoln. The Lipson Market provided occasion to raise some funds and \$370 was added to our account. Thank you to everyone who supported this, with special thanks to the two non members who supplied goodies for the trading table.

Dear Community Members,

After consistent feedback and conversations with various age and community groups, it has come to our attention that our community is lacking a readily accessible, user-friendly basketball facility in Cummins.

Representatives from the Cummins and Districts Basketball Association and the Cummins Memorial Recreation Centre, along with enthusiastic community members, are hoping to provide a solution to this recreational shortfall.

It is with great excitement that we are planning and proposing a new community half-court basketball facility, to be located on the vacant block of land between the CWA building and the skate park. The proposed area has been pegged out for anyone to view.

This proposed half-court facility will be an asset to the community and will provide a place that can be utilised during all seasons, by all community members, with the existing basketball courts not easily accessible. It will positively complement the skate park and playground area, and will be a welcomed addition to the Rec Centre.

This half-court project itself will involve the laying of a concrete slab, a panelled 'Dream court' surface with marked half court, a heavy-duty outdoor spec post, backboard and ring, and a 3-metre chain-link fence to enclose the back court end. (See attached plan)

Quoting for this half-court project has been completed and the total cost for the project is \$50,000. This includes all materials, labour, and supplied basketball equipment.

We are seeking support from local businesses and community groups to make this proposal a reality. We wish to extend your business the opportunity to support this project by financially contributing at a level most suited to you. 

A memorial to the Barwell Boys who emigrated to South Australia as part of the Barwell Boy Farming Apprenticeship Scheme from 1922 - 1924 to replace farming men lost in World War 1. It was for lads aged 15 to 18 years from the United

Kingdom and was followed by the Little Brothers Scheme in 1927.

A total of 1440 boys emigrated and we acknowledge the sacrifices that they made to assist with the development of our early Agricultural Industries.

what to expect at these groups:

Alternatives to Suicide (Alt2Su) groups, and those inspired by Alt2Su, offer non-clinical spaces where people can be honest about their distress and experiences related to suicide without fear of forced treatment, other forms of coercion, or risk assessment that shuts conversation down.

There are no forms to fill out and you won't be asked for any of your personal details. Groups start on time and people take turns sharing, asking questions and offering/receiving support. You will not be forced to share if you do not want to and you don't need to be experiencing a current crisis to attend.

Groups are facilitated by people with their own lived experience of suicide distress, thoughts and experiences. Newcomers are welcome.
