### SA Health COVID Clinics

All adults aged 16 to 49 living in Eyre and Far North are now eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, in addition to the currently eligible groups. Pfizer is the preferred COVID-19 vaccine for everyone under 50 and it is currently available at the Port Lincoln Clinic. People in this group will not be able to book through the national eligibility checker, only the link provided on the SA Health website. The Eyre and Far North Local Health Network is also currently planning pop-up Pfizer clinics across the Local Health Network.
