The Federal Court of Australia held the final hearing on country for the Nauo No 1 and Nauo No 2 Native Title Claim on Monday, May 15 in Coffin Bay.

Elected Members and staff attended in support of the Nauo people.

Mayor Jo-Anne Quigley congratulated the Nauo people on their recognition.

"My fellow Elected Members and staff were honoured to mark the occasion with the Nauo people," Mayor Quigley said.

"Lower Eyre Council is in the early stages of developing a Reconciliation Action Plan and we look forward to working with all relevant parties to create this foundational document for our district and its people."

Flinders Highway update

The last section of sealing at the Flinders Highway/ Wine Shanty Road intersection will be undertaken tomorrow (May 18).

This will only be delayed if continued rain does not allow the surface to dry.

The sealing will commence after 10am at which time traffic delays of 15 to 20 minutes may be experienced.

The new seal will need time to cure, consequently Contractors and Council are requesting that care is taken when trafficking the intersection for the next few weeks.

This is the last of the sealing works to occur this year with the final seal over the whole length of the project to happen in early 2024.

Temporary office closure


