

Expansion of Kerbside Recycling to Edillilie

Following consultation with residents of minor townships within the Lower Eyre Council, a decision has been made not to expand the fortnightly kerbside recycling program into those towns, with the exception of Edillilie.

A survey was conducted to determine whether residents would like to have access to a kerbside recycling service with an outcome being that 62% of minor town residents do not wish for the service to be provided.

Results show that many residents of minor townships are against the kerbside recycling service due to the additional costs involved, as well as the small number of household members to warrant the service.

"A number of minor townships contain primarily holiday homes that are irregularly occupied, causing the less demand for kerbside recycling" Chief Executive Officer, Delfina Lanzilli commented.

Lower Eyre Council Mayor Quigley wants to reassure residents who elected for the service that "even though there is currently a low demand for this service, options for expansion of recycling services will be investigated again in the future with feedback being considered".

Mayor Quigley and Chief Executive Officer Delfina Lanzilli, thanked the minor township residents who participated in the survey and provided feedback.
