

Business of the Year

CUMMINS DISTRICT COMMUNITY BANK BRANCH OF BENDIGO BANK

As a locally-owned and operated bank, the Cummins District Community Bank returns up to 50 per cent of the annual profit to the community through partnerships in grant funding for community projects, sponsorship of local groups, clubs and organisations, as well as shareholder dividend payments.

The business has grown significantly taking the total business footings to \$217.5 million in the last financial year ending June 30, 2018.

The branch employs four full-time staff and five part-time staff and works with Cummins Area School to offer a 12-month school-based traineeship to students.

The bank is run by the board of Cummins District Financial Services, which encompasses 10 voluntary directors and employs a part-time secretary.

Indirectly over the last 18 years, the bank has partnered with various government departments, businesses, organisations and groups to add value to our district.

The bank has assisted with childcare and health workers accommodation, Mentally Fit EP, and the Cummins and District Enterprise Committee Project Officer position as well as supporting Council's own Economic Community Development Officer position.

Community Organisation of the Year **ARMISTICE COMMUNITY GROUP**

The formation of the Armistice Community Group followed the Federal Government initiative known as the 'Centenary of ANZAC 2014 to 2018'.

The group's hard working volunteers; Dot Meegan, Jill Shultz, Jane Majoor, John Majoor, John Dunstan, Lee Clayton, Trevor Morrow and Kerry Richter organised and conducted ANZAC memorial services at Gallipoli Beach from 2014 to 2018. Each of the services commenced with a veteran aircraft fly pass and

concluded with a temporary museum of memorabilia displayed at the Marble Range Community and Sport Centre. At least 400 people from all over Australia attended each of the moving services held at Gallipoli Beach.

With 2018 being the last service, the group set about ensuring the spirit would live on. The group built a permanent war memorial hosting 10 bronze plaques on Gallipoli Beach Road, Farm Beach with the project unveiled to the public on November 11, 2018.

Young Citizen of the Year **CHARLIE BUDDLE**

Charlie demonstrates a desire to help the community flourish, and to assist the youth of the district to be the best they can be.

Charlie is involved in the Yallunda Flat Cricket Club, Cummins Kapinnie Football Club, Cummins and District Basketball Association and has also volunteered his time at the Cummins Area School, leading to Charlie being employed as a Student Support Officer.

Charlie has been captain of the Yallunda Flat cricket team for the last two years, coaches the Redback's junior cricket team, plays A grade

football for Cougars and coaches the mini-mini team. He also coaches an inter boys Cummins basketball.

Charlie's community-minded spirit has also seen him volunteer with the Cummins Show and he is an advocate for people with diabetes—his own experiences driving him to help raise funds for diabetes research.

Charlie has also given his time to help out at Cummins Area School events and work as a mentor for students, and he is now a well respected Student Support Officer.

Citizen of the Year **INGRID KENNERLEY**

Ingrid approaches her volunteering for local sporting clubs and community groups with a selfless attitude.

Ingrid is an active member of the Cummins and District War Memorial Swimming Pool, Rambler Netball Club, Yallunda Flat Show Society, Great Flinders Football League, Cummins District Financial Services board and Mental Health Advisory Group.

Her time as treasurer for the swimming pool has spanned an incredible 14 years while she has also been a long time volunteer for Rambler Netball Club. Her roles have included Secretary, Recorder, Uniform Coordinator, Trophy Coordinator and volunteered as umpire, timer, scorer and to work on canteen. For nine years she was also the combined

canteen representative.

In 2018 Ingrid took on Great Flinders Football League treasurer, and secretary for the Cummins Community Bank board.

The Yallunda Flat Show Society and Cummins Christmas Wonderland are another two causes to benefit from Ingrid's volunteered time.

People connect with Ingrid and it is her own experience with the tragedy of depression and suicide that has enabled her to provide support to those in our community through being mentor for the Mental Health Advisory Group.

Ingrid also works locally and has raised children Nakita and Jacob to become the exceptional young adults they are today.
