

Cummins Branch

Meals on Wheels is a not-for-profit, community-based volunteer organisation working throughout South Australia. It provides support to members of the community to live independently by delivering fresh, nutritious meals on week days and also provides vital regular social contact.

The Cummins Branch of Meals on Wheels was established in March 1976, with one meal recipient, and in the following few months rapidly grew to six. Cummins now has 9 listed meal recipients, but this number varies on a daily basis. The Cummins Branch has delivered in excess of 100,000 meals to clients over the 45 years it have been established. Currently there are 70 women and men volunteers who work on a six week rotation roster. The delicious three course meals (soup, hot main course and dessert) are produced by the wonderful kitchen staff at the Cummins and District Memorial Hospital.



The driver payment generally given to volunteers, has been stockpiled over the years, with the proceeds going towards purchasing equipment etc to benefit the community. Over the last few years, five televisions have been purchased and installed in conjunction with the upgrade of rooms at the hospital.

Extra volunteers are always welcome and a new roster will be drawn up in early 2022. Volunteering takes less than an hour, once every six weeks. HELP US SAVE THE TRISHAW!

Cycling Without Age Cummins is a volunteer group of community-minded individuals who provide the elderly, and not so able, with the opportunity to experience the wind in their hair by going on a ride in a specially-built trishaw bike. Seniors, and other residents alike, benefit from waving to people they pass on the way, having a conversation, or singing with their other passenger and their pilot or, to put it simply, from the joy of being socially included again in their community.

However, **this treasured community service is currently in jeopardy** due to, mainly, two reasons: lack of volunteers and being unable to cover the ongoing maintenance costs.

Without enough volunteers/pilots, the committee cannot be sustainable long-term, and the trishaw will, unfortunately, stop operating in Cummins, so we need **YOU**! If you're looking for a free moderate-level fitness exercise that gives back to your community, this could be it.

We're in the search for motivated pilots to ride the bike, and the process of becoming a volunteer is straight forward: all you need is a current police check, and a bicycle helmet!

(But if you haven't got either of those, we can help!)

Training is also provided.

Our committee doesn't want cost to be a prohibitive factor for the continuity of Cycling Without Age, however, in order to keep the trishaw in our town, we also need to raise funds of over \$1000 a year for insurance, maintenance and other bits and pieces.

There are donation tins in different businesses around Cummins, and we welcome every donation, and offer sponsorship opportunities for businesses or organisations wishing to advertise their support. Every dollar and every bit of help we can get will secure the future of the trishaw in Cummins!




