Coffin Bay Vegetation Works

Vegetation works along Coffin Bay's coastal area will be carried out in coming weeks, thanks to a partnership between Lower Eyre Council and Lower Eyre Coastcare Association with funding from the Eyre Peninsula Landscape Board's Grassroots Grants program and Council.

- Works to be undertaken include:
 Weed removal by a qualified contractor, with follow up
 - contractor, with follow up work by the community, led by

Coastcare volunteers.

- Revegetation of the Council trial sites where dead timber was removed. Assessment of these trial sites by the EP Landscape Board found these areas to be prone overgrowth of highly flammable weeds and has a negative impact on remaining native vegetation. The findings recommend revegetating the trial sites to suppress the growth of the highly flammable vegetation types.
- Revegetation of areas where weeds have been removed or vegetation has been illegally cleared over the last five years and in line with the Coffin Bay Foreshore Management Plan 2013.

The revegetation works is being coordinated by Lower Eyre Coastcare and will involve students from Cummins Area School and Lake Wangary School as part of National Tree Day. Members of the community are also invited to participate in the upcoming works through weed removal and planting days.
