Community Event of the Year

Empowering Lower Eyre has been recognised for its 2021 Get Out Music & Arts Festival - a free community event that focuses on youth mental health.

The event aimed to create community connections to reduce isolation and loneliness in young people. Held in Cummins on 10 April 2021, more than 1000 people attended the family day out full of local music, food, workshops and more.

The festival was first held in 2020 with minimal student input, and now 2022's festival already has 26 secondary students wanting to play an active role.

The event continues to go from strength to strength and was selected as a semi finalist in the 2021 South Australian Community Achievement Awards.

Lake Wangary School

Organisation of the Year

Lake Wangary School has been recognised for its Minya Custodians program that focuses on connecting children to country, culture and custodianship.

Students are visiting local areas to assess the health of the environment through data collection and observations. They then come up with ideas to protect, maintain and create sustainable areas.

As well as working with a local Nauo Elder and archaeologist, students have been working with Council, the EP Landscape Board, National Parks and Wildlife, EP Analysis and Friends of Coffin Bay. Recent progress includes that new signage will be installed at the Greenly Beach area to protect the area.

Coffin Bay/ Port Lincoln Aquatic Centre Business of the Year

Head instructor Yvonne Ackland at Coffin Bay/ Port Lincoln Aquatic Centre has been recognised for sharing her knowledge of all things aquatic for the last approximate 30 years.
