CONTEMPLATING AUTUMN


Autumn is contemplative!



Cummins & Districts War Memorial Swimming Pool COMMUNITY FORUM

The Cummins Swimming Pool Committee is seeking enthusiastic and forward-thinking volunteers to help drive much-needed pool and facility upgrades.

A well-attended Community Forum gave the Committee the ability to gauge the community's future needs for the facility and take on new ideas.

President Mel Dickinson gave an outline of the pool history, in particular major projects undertaken over the years, and what was needed going forward.



There are several significant issues:

- Original sand filters and pump are still in use and have needed to be replaced for several years. (\$60,000).
- There is a large crack in the concrete on the northern end of the pool that has been repaired several times and has reappeared. The resulting water leak is causing cancer in the concrete and reinforcement (\$10,000).
- Options to fix include covering the crack with a new liner (\$130,000), fibreglass (\$170,000) or retile for a long-term solution (\$250,000).
- Baby pool needs new fibreglass (\$20,000).
- The meeting discussed what the value of the pool was to the community, to help guide any future upgrade plans. See next page for meeting suggestions.
- Note quotes are 1-3 years old.

Help Needed:

The Swimming Pool Committee wishes to form a Steering Group to drive the Pool Upgrade project. Some current members of the Committee will be part of the Steering Group, but it is looking for enthusiastic, committed, forward thinking people to join.

Objectives of this group will be to:

- Explore options for repair of the pool including getting quotes.
- Look at the precinct as a whole, consider upgrading to ensure it is fit for the future.
- Research and apply for funding opportunities.
- Look at a business model to ensure feasibility.

- DCLEP have already allocated \$40,000 as seed funding as well as providing annual ongoing funding for the running costs.
- Raise the pool as an important issue for our community at DCLEP Budget time

Flu vaccinations 2022

This coming flu season experts are expecting a re-emergence of influenza cases. Australia has experienced 2 years of very low circulating influenza virus, so natural boosting of immunity has not occurred, possibly individuals did not seek vaccination since there was "no flu around", and therefore immunity has likely waned.

Very young children, especially those under 3 years of age, have not likely experienced a first-time exposure to influenza virus so are at increased risk of contracting influenza.

We expect to be kicking off influenza vaccinations from early April.

Please take this next step in protecting yourself, your family and our community during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic.

Influenza vaccine will be available for all people aged 6 months and older.

We are not yet taking booking; but will notify the community via Facebook when booking; open.

- "Facilities Plan" of Health precinct: effective use of Hospital/Medical Clinic to address identified issues e.g, develop consulting spaces for expanded medical practice, accommodation needs of Hospital patient family, Allied Health office space/consulting rooms, storage (records/equipment/medical supplies.)
- Hospital services area upgrades (grounds/maintenance/kitchen/laundry/morgue.)
- 2.**Recruitment:** Doctor Succession Plan Work/ life balance is critical for rural practice GPs. Need to attract more doctors and health professionals and ensure infrastructure meets needs of the workforce (housing/consulting rooms/treatment space/records/administration.)
- -Consider models of best practice service delivery from other rural districts nationally. Appears "walk in- walk out" practice arrangements now the norm for medical professionals! Make Medical practice attractive to be a participant. Be Innovative! Considering co-op models operating interstate.
- -Prepare business plan to look at feasibility of appropriate model for sustaining medical services in Cummins. Consolidate for the future!
- 3. **Future Focus:** Create a focus for Cummins within EP Health Industry. LEHAC has recommended Aged Care and Rehabilitation services.

COUNCIL NEWS

Completion of Coffin Bay Cemetery Enhancements

Council allocated \$40,000 of grant funding towards improvements at the Coffin Bay Cemetery.

Last week Council staff completed the improvements which included:

- Multisided gazebo
- Two bench seats
- New entrance which includes mirror image garden beds.

These improvements really enhance the area, and we hope that family and visitors enjoy the new look and infrastructure.





Fishery Bay Funding

Council has been successful in securing \$135,000 funding under PIRSA's Recreational Fishing, Boating and Camping Facilities Fund Grant program and \$58,000 from the Department of Environment and Water to formalise camping at Fishery Bay.

The scope for campsite upgrades includes new campsite delineation, landscaping and signage. Council is thankful for the assistance of both PIRSA and DEW to deliver camping facilities at Fishery Bay.



Replacement of Drain - Charlton Gully Road

The construction team have just safely completed the replacement of a major drain that had failed on Charlton Gully Road. Council thanks the public for their patience whilst the team carried out this work.



Skate Park

The Skate Park at Cummins Rec Centre has had a reseal of the concrete surface this week by the Northern Maintenance Team. This reseal is an annual maintenance requirement to maximise the safety, function and enjoyment of the space for users and the broader community and ensures the facility remains a valuable and useable public asset.




