This is my story - Adewale Olanrewaju {Wale}

While growing up in my 'original' hometown of Ila-Orangun, Nigeria, our parents would always remind us in our native language, 'Yoruba' that "Ọlọrun nikan lo mọ ibiti kadara ma gbe ọ lo ni ọjọ iwaju", meaning "Only God knows where destiny will take you in the future". That colloquial statement by my progenitors summarises my journey to Cummins.

I was born more than three decades ago in a regional farming community with strong family ties and Christian faith. Although we were blessed with good missionary schools grounded in British curriculum, I did not know much about this great country called Australia until later in high school when I studied Geography. Nonetheless, after my first degree and whilst preparing for greener pastures abroad, Canada and United States of America were my top priorities due to their proximity to Africa and recommendations from family and friends. But 'kadara' (destiny) brought me to Australia in February 2016 for postgraduate studies at University of Technology, Sydney before my wife and I eventually left for Adelaide in July 2016 where we have since found the serenity, we always desire.

After completing my second degree from the University of South Australia in 2019, it was easy for my family to go rural SA where needs were greater for our professional callings. Although I did not choose Cummins as a practice destination but again, 'kadara' and my wonderful boss-cum-mentor, Lolu did. He told me so many great things about the community long before I came here. But as Queen of Sheba rightly confessed to king Solomon 'I didn't believe what was said until I arrived here and saw it with my own eyes. In fact, I had not heard the half of it! Your wisdom and prosperity are far beyond what I was told.' (1King 10:7). Such narrative captures my overall experience in Cummins till date.

The premier reason this loving community will always be part of my memoir is the incontrovertible family bonds amongst the dwellers. What a daily joy to serve the intergeneration of grandparents, hardworking parents, siblings, uncles, cousins, aunties, nephews who are not just interrelated but very connected to one another! No wonder there is so much peace and tranquility in Cummins. I would like to thank everyone once again in the district and neighboring areas for the unequivocal support you have given to Lolu and the team hitherto, which is fundamental to my coming here. Kudos also to the editors of the Cummins connection for giving me the rare opportunity to share my 'long' and boring story. Lol!



On the club's annual trips over a 5 -14 day period, the Volks Enthusiasts Club selects a charity to support. On this trip we visit Cummins for lunch on Thursday 30th March for a look at Mosaic art work. The Cummins Lions Club are hosting the event with a sausage sizzle from 11:30am and proceeds will go to the Cummins Hospital Auxilliary.

We are anticipating 14 cars on the journey (around 30 people) and all of these will be Volkswagens.

The EP trip is via Kimba, Streaky Bay, Coffin Bay, Arno Bay and Port Broughton.

A Bit of History... Cummins Caravan Park

In December 1997, the Cummins & District Enterprise Committee (CDEC) wrote to District Council Lower EP indicating Cummins needed a caravan park in the town. Council was asked to consider this request. After community and business interest was surveyed the selection of a suitable site for such a facility stalled. In November 1998, CDEC recommended the most suitable site was the old Council depot area, where Tidy Towns had already planted trees, and both power and toilet facilities could be conveniently developed. Access was reasonable, and the space of the block offered potential for future expansion.

A public meeting was conducted in November 1999 to report on the feasibility study by an independent consultant. A community survey was conducted to gauge opinions on "Does Cummins need a Caravan Park?" and a preferred site. 261 responses were received with 66% in favour of the Railway Triangle. The working group nominated from the public meeting included Wendy Holman, Karl Maughan, Ken Arnold, Bill Harris, Terry Vigar, Adrian Thiele, David Hall. During 2000, numerous meetings followed and a site plan was drawn up with proposed 6 site facility and a selfcontained amenities block. The Management of the Caravan Park was a further consideration and a budget was developed. An approx. cost of establishing the Caravan Park was \$40,000.

Work finally began in 2001, and on December 12, 2001 retiring Council Chairman Mr Bill Watkins officially opened the Cummins Caravan Park as a fully functional facility with four ensuite units, and four other powered sites.

In 2002 two railway carriages were set up in the park to be developed as accommodation options. One "kitchen/ cook's van" came from Ceduna, and one passenger carriage was transported from Port Augusta on 14 February in 40 degree heat with Bevan and Liz Mickan and Geoff and Wendy Holman preparing it for transport and then escorting in convoy to Cummins.





Once the carriages were in place several working bees were held to improve these carriages. Financial difficulties for CDEC after other events struggled to make profit, meant that finances were not available for work to be done to the Caravan Park facilities. Work lapsed. The Committee decision was made to quit one of the railway carriages, and develop cabin accommodation instead.

Cabins were installed in 2010 with a Community Bank grant and Loan from Council. This loan was finally paid in December 2020.



Twenty years on, the Cummins Caravan and Cabin Park is well used by travellers either visiting the region or while employed in seasonal work or business. Harvest is especially busy.

The Park is well maintained and a beautiful green space. Wikicamps shows up loads of compliments. Management is by a volunteer committee, and bookings are managed through staff at Cummins Takeaway and Deli. Cleaning is shared by Sandy Jones and Haley Williams, while Peter Hind took over from Bill Harris and continues to maintain the grounds and facilities.

Many locals have supported the development of the Cummins Caravan and Cabin Park over the past 22 years. Change is being discussed with Council to set up a more professional approach for Cummins Caravan Park.
