### Purchase of Cummins Recyclers Business

Media Release – 15 January 2024

As recently advertised, Lower Eyre Council have purchased the Cummins Recycling Business from the Norton family and are expected to take ownership in February 2024. The recycling service has been provided to the Cummins, Coffin Bay and surrounding areas by the Norton family for the last 20 years. Council are grateful to be given the opportunity to continue to provide this important and beneficial service to the Lower Eyre Community.

Mayor Jo-Anne Quigley said *‘that Council knew that it was vital to our ongoing recycling effort that the community retained a place they can locally take their cans and bottles to and were pleased to be able to purchase this vibrant business.’*

Equipment at Council’s Waste Transfer Stations in Cummins and Coffin Bay will require alterations to allow for the recycling operations on site, and Council is grateful that the Norton family have agreed to host Council at their sites for the next six months whilst this work occurs.

Commencing 4 February 2024, the recycling depot hours will be as follows:

- Coffin Bay – Norton’s Depot, Lawrie Road, Coffin Bay
  - Sunday, 9am – 12pm
  - Tuesday, 2pm – 4pm
- Cummins – Norton’s Depot, 40-48 Hayman Drive, Cummins
  - Sunday, 2pm – 4:30pm
  - Tuesday, - 8:30am – 12pm

Elected Members and Council staff appreciate and thank Heather and Glyn Norton for their continuing support and guidance in preparing for the change of ownership and

providing such a valuable service to our community.

As Council works through the ownership changeover and general operations, more information will be provided to the community on recycling collection and receipt processes.
