Community Grants open!

Applications are open for a share in \$52,000 in council grant funding across three categories for individuals, community and sporting groups.

The Community Project Grant aims to assist local, not-for-profit groups to improve community infrastructure.

The Community Halls Support Program aims to assist community groups maintain or upgrade their hall.

The Individual – Educational and Cultural Grant aims to assist local people access academic, music, art or cultural events or activities at a State, National or International level.

Applications close at 12pm, Friday, December 16, 2022. Download the application forms on Council's website.

Draft plan released for Poonindie Cemetery

A draft Poonindie Cemetery Management Plan is available for public consultation.

The plan determines future maintenance requirements and construction priorities and has been developed in an effort to ensure the cemetery is managed in a way which will preserve its cultural and heritage values.

The plan proposes to identify interment sites with markers, establish a more prevalent entrance gate and install signage, establish rabbit-proof fencing around the whole cemetery, and formalise car parking and a walking path.

The plan proposed to install a gazebo-style shelter as a place of reflection, and looks at landscaping and ground surface improvements.

Fire prevention

In accordance with Local Guidelines 2022 -

- No permits will be granted for hazard reduction burning during FDS.
- No permits will be granted for burning of heaped vegetation (unless it has been deemed a risk to an asset).
- Permits granted for Broad Acre Burning will be from February 1st 2023.
- A permit is not needed for a comfort fire.
