



World Day of Prayer 2023

World Day of Prayer in Cummins on Friday, 3 March was one of 170 services being held around the world. The Cummins New Beginnings Church hosted the service, which began at 10am, with over 30 people attending. This year's service was prepared by the women of Taiwan and the theme was "I have heard your faith". Christine Kelly welcomed everyone to the service, and explained the cover art on the

prayer booklet. It depicted the women praying as darkness fills the sky. Christian faith brings peace and vision despite Taiwan's uncertain future along with significant species of birds, the Mikado Pheasant and the black faced Spoonbill, and the Butterfly Orchid, which is the pride of Taiwan.

Ian Pearson played the organ for the hymns sung throughout the service, while members of the Catholic, Lutheran and Anglican churches also participated in the service.

Diane Secker read the Bible reading from Ephesians1: 15-20, while stories from five Taiwanese women telling about their Christian faith that had inspired them to live the life they had were read by Marg Phelps, Elaine Jericho, Gladys Hall, Beryl Taylor and Josie Hammond.

Prayers of thanksgiving for these five women were read, and we were all encouraged to pray for the Spirit of wisdom and revelation to show us all how we might serve others in our own lives, come to know God better, and understand God's love for us.

Prayers of confession were read by Fr John Folkman, Catholic Priest, who has recently been installed as the Parish Priest, serving Cummins, Tumby Bay and Elliston parishes. Welcome Fr John!

Pastor Peter Klemm, Lutheran Minister, introduced the Bible Society Film about this year's Project – Support for Immigrant brides of Taiwan (half million women), to promote their wellbeing and that of their families.

The offering was taken up and raised \$298. Pastor Peter Klemm said an offering prayer, followed by the Lord's Prayer said by everyone.

In his absence, Reverend Stephen Albrecht had organised a video clip in which he did the commissioning for the 2024 service – Focus from Palestine on the theme "Bear with one another in love." He announced that the Catholic Church would be the hosts, and prayed a blessing upon them and upon those who will meet to prepare the service. He also sent us out with the Benediction. He prayed that the Holy Spirit might open our hearts, so that we can be a blessing to others. Closing Hymn – "The day you gave us Lord, has ended" was sung before morning tea and social interaction took place.





CUMMINS COMMUNITY GARDEN - UPDATE

Following our recent meeting we have decided to run a couple of very informal workshops for propagating, both taking cuttings and budding fruit trees. This would need to be fairly soon as peaches and nectarines are best done now. Aiming for after Easter sometime. We are looking for expressions of interest from the public. Attached is the poster we have created in advertising interest and feedback!

A grafting workshop will be planned for August or early September which is the optimal time for that, being for apples mainly. Again anyone interested we would love to hear from you.

A lot of summer vegetables are finishing up now, with some left for seed saving. We are planning our winter vegies now and with our new long archway almost complete, we can plant our different pea varieties to climb over the arch. Even some sweet peas for a bit of winter colour!

Our next working bee is planned for Friday and Saturday 5th and 6th of May from 9.30am – 12.30pm each day. Anyone interested in joining in either day or both would be most welcome. It is planned to do a bit of brick paving where the gate runs, finish off a couple of wicking beds and fill, take the timbers off the kids wicking beds to fix the tec screw leaks, re-fit with shorter tec screws, level the existing wicking beds that have dropped, put compost on some vegie beds and a general tidy up.

We are looking for anyone who has second hand pipe in the larger sizes of 1.1/2" or 1.1/4" that would be at least 2.5 metres long who would be willing to donate it to the Gardens. We are wanting to build a structure for grapes to grow over for shading our work area. It would be gratefully received.

We have given most of our committee members coordinator rolls to share within their interests within the garden, to keep on top of the garden! We have, Mean Green (weeds) Coordinators, Flower Garden Coordinators, Herbs and bushtucker Coordinators, Infrastructure Coordinators, Wicking beds and fruit trees Coordinators, Back Garden and Klds area Coordinators, Grapes Coordinator, Watering Coordinators and Artistic Coordinators.

We are still planning on an "Opening Event" hopefully in the near future, although there are still a few jobs/infrastructure we would like get completed in the garden before hand. Such as potting area, framework over seating area etc.

Members are also continually on the hunt for grants, to cover cost for future plans such as security cameras, pizza oven, upgrading the CWA toilets/back room and so on! So please feel free to alert us if you hear of any up for grabs!

A special mention goes out to Peter Glover who kindly carted a big tanker full of rainwater to fill one of our big tanks. That should get us through until the winter rains. Thanks for your time and effort Peter.
