

To our Customers, Carers & Families,

Exciting news about new beginnings for Meals on Wheels SA as we move into a new Central Office and Production Kitchen and COVID-19 restrictions are further eased.

With so much going on in 2020, a very significant change has occurred without fanfare. In May 2020, Meals on Wheels SA moved into a new purpose-built office and cook chill production facility.

We have moved to 80-84 Sir Donald Bradman Drive, Hilton, South Australia 5033.

All other contact details remain the same.

The rigorous Food Safety Standards that apply to our service require us to provide all customers with our correct business address with every meal delivery. This applies for all meals prepared by or for Meals on Wheels SA, regardless of where the meal was cooked or by whom. We do this by printing our business address on the main course lid. Until our order of new lids arrives, every meal you receive will come with a business card showing our correct business address, to make sure that we comply with the regulatory requirement.

Our new cook chill production facility is fully operational from 29 June 2020. This, along with easing of COVID-19 restrictions, means a return to usual meal production and distribution from that date. All chilled meals, frozen meals, texture-modified meals and special dietary requirement meals will once again be produced by Meals on Wheels SA. All of our volunteer-staffed kitchens will have returned to full operations, including providing your choice of main course.

Customers in most country areas had no changes to service delivery during the pandemic emergency. You will continue to receive meals purchased by Meals on Wheels from your local supplier. We are working towards extending the range and variety of meals available in more rural locations.

Thank you for your patience and understanding of the changes we had to make during the pandemic. We are so proud that we were able to continue delivering meals to everyone that asked for help during this time. We had amazing support from our long-serving and new volunteers. You may start seeing some familiar faces as we welcome back those volunteers who took the precaution to temporarily stop volunteering.

The current COVID-19 precautions are likely to be with us for some time. This means we will continue to maintain a safe distance between you and your meal deliverers, continue extra hand hygiene, and reinforce the need for volunteers to stay home if they are feeling unwell. Meals on Wheels has been and will continue to be here for you and the community during this time. We are continually monitoring the situation, responding to Government advice, and preparing to act swiftly and with minimal disruption if extra community restrictions or safety measures are necessary.



# \$13,200 for local groups

A total of 44 local community groups and sporting clubs will receive a \$300 COVID-19 package from Council – a combined donation of \$13,200.

The funds will go towards fixed building costs in recognition of the impact of the closure directives on the organisations. To view the full list, refer to Council's meeting minutes for 17 July 2020.

### Community bus back

Following the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions the community bus is back available for hire, but it will be at a reduced number capacity.

For now the bus can carry a maximum of 13 people and extra precautions still need to be made including extra touch point cleaning and a tracing record completed for Council to retain in case it is required by SA Health.

# New planning system

The Planning and Design Code (the Code) is the cornerstone of South Australia's new planning and development system and will offer a single set of planning policies for assessing applications across the state. To ensure that all South Australians are

o ensure that all South Australians are confident and familiar with the new planning system, access to the online Code is now available for communities in Phase One (Outback Areas) and Phase Two (Rural Areas) via the new ePlanning platform. The Code is scheduled to go live across rural South Australia on 31 July 2020.

### Hardship Policy / COVID-19 Assistance

Council have adopted a new Financial hardship policy to assist ratepayers who are experiencing financial difficulty.

In relation to the current health pandemic Council have resolved to waive fines and interest on payments for March through to August (inclusive) for those customers that can demonstrate a reduction of 30 per cent or more in business income, or who are experiencing a reduction in working hours due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
