Changes to budget consultation

Due to changes made to the Draft 2021/22 Budget at the Ordinary Council Meeting on June 18, public consultation dates have been altered. Council is proposing to undertake a fortnightly kerbside recycling collection trial in Boston, Coffin Bay, Cummins, Louth Bay, North Shields, Poonindie, Tiatukia, & Tulka to commence as soon as practicable in the 2021/22 financial year.

A service charge of \$150 - \$180 to residents within those townships is anticipated to cover the cost of the trial kerbside recycling collection service. Submissions on the draft budget will now close at 5pm on Wednesday, July 14 for Council to consider all submissions at the Ordinary Council Meeting on July 16. Council expect to adopt the 2021/22 Annual Business Plan & Budget at a Special Council Meeting on July 30.

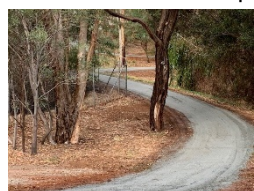
Long Term Financial Plan & Asset Management Plan
