DrumMuster

The next drum collection service will be held at the Cummins Waste Transfer Station on the 25th and 26th of July. This service is ran successfully twice per year, and enables farm chemical users to return their empty, cleaned, non-returnable, steel, and plastic farm chemical containers. Containers must be triple rinsed, clean, and dry, have lids removed, and metal drums should be punctured.
