1. AUSTRALIA DAY CELEBRATIONS

The Lower Eyre Council will celebrate Australia Day by hosting a Community Breakfast at Cummins on 26 January each year, to be followed by a presentation ceremony conducted by the Council Mayor for the Award winners.

The breakfast may request a gold coin donation which will be provided to a local charity following the breakfast.

Council will consider participating in community-initiated Australia Day Breakfast events throughout the region on a case-by-case basis.

2. AWARD CATEGORIES

Awards will be presented to reflect outstanding achievements throughout the Council district in the following categories: -

- Citizen of the Year
- Young Citizen of the Year
- Community Event of Year / Organisation of the Year
- Business of the Year
- Employee of the Year

Award categories and the format or proceedings at the Cummins event are subject to change at the discretion of the Council.



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3. AWARD CRITERIA

3.1 CITIZEN OF THE YEAR

- 3.1.1 Significant contribution to the community, including some or all of the following traits:
 - o Displays leadership
 - Inspirational role model for the whole community
 - Voluntary contribution to community or sporting organisations
 - The person has undertaken activity that has raised the profile of the Lower Eyre Council or a local area.
- 3.1.2 In assessing nominations for the Citizen of the Year consideration will be given to the impact the individual's contribution has had on the Lower Eyre Council as a whole, or within a local community.
- 3.1.3 To be eligible for the Citizen of the Year person must be an Australian citizen, and must live in the local area.
- 3.1.4 Nominations containing letters of support will be viewed favourably.

3.2 YOUNG CITIZEN OF THE YEAR

- 3.2.1 Significant contribution to the community, including demonstrating some or all of the following traits: -
 - Voluntary contribution to community or sporting organisations
 - o Excellence in sport, music, the arts or other recreational activities
 - Displays Leadership
 - Inspirational role model for young people
 - Activity that has raised the profile of the District Council of Lower Eyre Peninsula
- 3.2.2 The Young Citizen of the Year is open to people aged under 30 years of age at 1 January of the applicable year.
- 3.2.3 Nominations containing letters of support will be viewed favourably.

3. AWARD CRITERIA

3.3 COMMUNITY EVENT / ORGANISATION OF THE YEAR

Nominations for the Community Event / Organisation of the Year may be made against either of the following criteria:

3.3.1 Community event

- A community event enjoyed by a significant number of people which included some or all of the following traits:
 - A high standard of organisation leading to enjoyment by those people attending
 - Significant voluntary contribution towards the success of the event
 - An event that raised the profile of an organisation or attracted people to visit our district
 - An event that recognised the history of our district, or history within an organisation
- Nominations containing letters of support for the event will be viewed favourably.

3.3.2 Organisation of the Year

- An organisation providing recreational, educational or social opportunity to the community portraying some or all of the following characteristics:
 - A high level of involvement with the local community.
 - Strong leadership leading to high, or increased participation levels within membership
 - Provision of an event enjoyed by members and the community alike
- Nominations containing letters of support for the organisation will be viewed favourably.



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3. AWARD CRITERIA

CONT'D:

3.4 BUSINESS OF THE YEAR

- 3.4.1 The Business of the Year will provide a valuable service to the community demonstrating some or all of the following traits: -
 - A service adding to the lifestyle of local people
 - o A service providing valuable on-service to local businesses
 - A business portraying positive, consistent and memorable customer service
 - A business employing local people
 - A business adding to the profile of a local area or the wider Council district
- 3.4.2 To be eligible, the business must have an ABN, and operate within the Council area.
- 3.4.3 Nominations containing letters of support will be viewed favourably.

3.5 EMPLOYEE OF THE YEAR

- 3.5.1 Nominees must demonstrate exemplary performance of work activities that are above and beyond the scope of assigned responsibilities including:
 - Positive, consistent and memorable customer service
 - Demonstrated enthusiasm for the role
 - Commitment to the business
- 3.5.2 To be eligible, nominees must be employed within the Lower Eyre Council district, but do not have to reside within the Council area.
 - Nominations containing letters of support will be viewed favourably.

4. ADMINISTRATION

- 4.1 Nomination periods will not be extended if insufficient applications are received and no award will be given for the relevant year in that category.
- 4.2 Council reserves the right to not award a category even if applications have been received if it deems the applications do not meet the criteria.
- 4.3 Award nominations for current staff or Elected Members will not be accepted.
