# **PRESIDENTS REPORT**

Hello Coffin Bay,

Hope you all had a lovely Christmas and I wish everyone the very best for 2020. What a very busy time the past couple of months have been. The week before Christmas we held a great Christmas Party and Markets at the Hall. Rachel Saxby's idea to have the Markets on the same day as the Party was a great idea as there was something there for everyone. The Hall looked very festive and was packed with great stalls. Adults enjoyed the food, coffee, music by the PL Band and sipping a glass of bubbly while watching the kids have a great time on the bouncing castle, having their faces painted, playing games and enjoying the craft table in the kitchen. Santa's arrival in the amazing float from the PL Community House was a real treat. Thank you to all that helped on the day, there is always so much setting up and packing away for this type of event.

Special thanks must go to the Myers children who helped pick up rocks, rake under the trees, set up games and move tables and chairs around and came back later in the evening to help put everything away. Well done guys you really made a difference. A special thankyou to Santa, we know how busy he is so to spend some time with the kids in Coffin Bay was very special.

On the 4<sup>th</sup> January we held our 3<sup>rd</sup> BAMM which again went off really well. Shame about the weather but we were all rather glad to see some rain. Again, great stalls, food and music and everyone seemed to be enjoying themselves and we have had great feedback regarding both events

Our year has started on a high as we have received another grant, this one from FRRR, Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal, more money to go towards Hall improvements. For those that don't know how Grants work I'll just mention the basic rules as some seem to think that Progress now has more money than they know what to do with. There is a great deal of work that goes into applying for a Grant, the paperwork seems endless, I've never done this before, and I find the whole process very time consuming. You must be very clear why you need the money, what it will be used for, how it will benefit the Community etc. If lucky enough to receive a Grant you have 12 months to carry out the projects, keeping a record of all expenditure, filling out a final report and if by chance you don't use all the money in that time you have to give it back. Our next Grant application will be for repairs to the Hall roof and fixing the ceilings that are starting to fall down, it's never ending.

I have also been asked what we do with the money that we raise from Hall hire, BAMM, Progress markets etc, well it goes into the bank to pay all the bills. Just to keep the Hall doors open is very expensive so we keep a certain amount in the bank at all times and as that is used to pay the bills and general repairs & maintenances, insurance is a huge expense, the account has to be topped up. We don't charge the Red Cross or the Library for using the Hall and for anyone that hires the Hall we just charge \$3.00 pp. We receive some money from advertising in the Sun and from Hall hire for the monthly markets. Occasionally we have a little extra so that is spent on items that are badly needed, a new fridge and a new vacuum for instance.

**So, our major fundraisers are very important, but we try hard and make them fun for us and the Community.** Talking of fundraisers, we have been thinking about having something in March to celebrate Progress's 70th Anniversary. Thinking along the lines of an old-fashioned Supper Dance, there was some really great music in the 50's. I'll keep you informed but we will need the Bar finished before that can happen so it might be delayed a little.

## **Gardening Tip**



#### by Phil Siviour – Coffin Bay Gardening Service

Roses only need sufficient water to avoid stress during the hot summer period. Nip off spent blooms, avoid cutting long stems. This will prevent strong new growth and inferior late summer flowers.

Tomatoes need extra care with watering this time of year. Blossom-end rot (where the flowering side of the fruit blackens and rots) is mainly caused by erratic watering. Regular watering is essential. Don't wait until the plant wilts.



Fruit tree watering needs to be regular even though the crop may have finished. This means the usual heavy, weekly drenching. This will set the tree up for storage of plant foods that will be used in developing buds, flowers and fruit for next summer

#### -Meet the Locals-WILLIE WAGTAIL

The Willie Wagtail needs no introduction. It is one of our most iconic and well- loved birds. They are found all over mainland Australia, preferring more open country, but have also adapted to life in urban areas.

Their high protein diet of many different types of insects must give them the energy to be hardly ever still, especially with their "wag-tailing". One willie I encountered while working in a back yard, flew down alongside and looked at me as much to say "well come on". My role, I discovered, was to upend rocks and bark, whereupon she pounced on the hiding insects, completely unafraid of my presence.

We have all heard Willie Wagtails especially on still moonlit nights singing the night away over the breeding season. The reasons why are unclear. Being a romantic at heart, I have no doubt that dad is serenading his missus while she is nesting.

There is now a good deal of evidence that many species of birds, willies included, pair for life. Even with all their restless energy, the average lifespan of WW's is 11 years.

The attached photos were kindly sent to me by Von, one of the long-suffering librarians at Pt. Lincoln who all with such good cheer help computer incompetents like myself. The willies successfully nested in her yard and the photos are a time sequence from mum sitting on the eggs to fully fledged youngsters. Note in #4 how the chicks have outgrown the nest and one is perched; and how thin dad is compared to mum. He has worn himself to a frazzle, repelling invaders such as currawongs, magpies, ravens, cats and humans, in between bringing home the bacon for three youngsters with bottomless appetites.

# Refuse Reduce Reuse Recycle Compost

This month: Bottle tops & coffee pods

Plastic bottle tops and coffee pods are no longer being collected for recycling at the Coffin Bay Post Office. Unfortunately, the local recycler is no longer operating. Nationally, Envision who were collecting bottle tops and experimenting with making mobility aids for children also stopped collecting as 1) they were overwhelmed with the number of lids sent to them, and 2) their trials with this type of plastic weren't successful.

So, what is the problem with recycling bottle tops? Recycling them as loose lids is problematic as their small size means they fall through the conveyer belt when material is sorted, leaving them on the bottle is a problem when the bottles are compressed.

For those that take their recyclable material to the Port Lincoln waste transfer facility there is a way to recycle them.

- 1. Remove the plastic liner from inside the lid
- 2. Place the lids into a large plastic bottle like a plastic milk bottle, plastic juice bottle, plastic detergent bottle or any other clean plastic bottle. This can be done by cutting a slot in the side of the bottle or bending the lid to fit through the top of the bottle
- 3. Fill the container and take to the recycler\*\*
- 4. \*\*Please note that at this time these are NOT accepted at the Coffin Bay and Cummins waste transfer stations



We are looking at collecting for another national organisation, Lids4Kids, who are continuing to collect lids but with details still to come. We are interested to hear from anyone who would like to assist with cleaning and sorting the lids for this organisation in the future. Email or call contacts below to register your interest

Coffee pods: despite claims of some coffee pods being biodegradable they will not biodegrade in a home compost system, they need industrial composting to reach the high temperatures required to breakdown. Of the coffee pods Nescafe is the only one that offers a recyclable pod made from aluminium. For Nescafe coffee pod users there are currently 2 local recycling points that collect and return the pods. *Note this is for Nescafe coffee pods only* 1) Lower Eyre Health Practice in Cummins, 2) Golden Sable Florist 10 Liverpool St Port Lincoln. Nescafe coffee pods users can also order their own Australia Post recycling satchel for the Nespresso webpage.
