The COVID-19 outbreak in Victoria puts South Australia at much greater risk of an outbreak.

We have seen interstate the impact the virus can have on aged care residents and we want to prevent that from happening in SA.

One way we can do that is by screening everyone who comes into our aged care facilities.

Visitors also need to provide proof they are protected from flu, in accordance with the Commonwealth Government Emergency Legislation that applies to all aged care facilities.

We are now recording the names and phone numbers of all visitors to aged care facilities to help with timely contact tracing if required.

Visiting hours are 2-3pm (3-4pm Ceduna) and 6-7pm.

Two visitors (maximum) are permitted to visit once a day but may be increased if required. Stay away if you are unwell, have a fever, cough or sore throat.

And 66,000 girls, now women of substance, flew into The Peace clenched small and tough and ready for something better.

Dead timber removal trial on hold

Council has put on hold any further removal of dead timber along the Oyster Walk and Coffin Bay foreshore area after seeking the views of Department of Environment and Water following completion of the three trial sites.

After inspecting the trial site, the Department has raised the following concerns:

- Considerable damage had occurred to the understory of the remaining vegetation.
- For two thirds of the sites there had been an increase in the weedy growth when compared to photos taken before the trial.
- The removal of the surface cover has left the sites more prone to erosion.
- There was minimal native vegetation regeneration observance since the trial.
- The removal of standing dead timber removed the potential for nesting hollow development.
- The trial left the remaining vegetation more exposed to the elements.
- Some of the standing trees showed signs they may have been alive when removed
- The trial resulted in a decrease in the habitat quality, quantity and diversity for native species.

There are also concerns that if the work continues it may see an increase in weed cover across the coastal zone, reduced germination and recruitment of native species, potential for increased erosion, removal of critical habitat for native species.

Council has now deferred any further dead timber removal works until at least Spring 2021 to assess if the concerns raised by the Department of Environment and Water are realised.
