


CHRISTMAS CAROLS



As it slaps the waves in spite.


On this 'Boys' Own' small outing





NEW 'WELCOME' SIGNS FOR CUMMINS

The Cummins and District Tourism Committee is excited to announce that we now have funding to update all five entrance 'welcome' signs into Cummins. The first four signs have been made and are currently having frames engineered by Cockaleechie Industries with support from the Men's Shed. These signs will replace those on Tumby Bay Road, Bratten Highway, Tod Highway (Yeelannaside) and Warrow Road.

The new signs have been made possible thanks to a Community Reserves Grant from the District Council of Lower Eyre Peninsula (DCLEP). Another successful grant application with DCLEP has secured us funding for the fifth 'welcome' sign to be updated.

The Tod Highway (Edilillie side) sign will feature a larger design than the other entrances, replacing the current "door" signage.

The signs will follow the branding look that the tourism committee has created through its "explore Cummins" website (www.explorecummins.com.au), postcards and visitor brochures, giving visitors a consistent image of the town. Given the amount of people who are now travelling around the State because of travel restrictions elsewhere, we feel it's increasingly important to provide these updated welcome signs to our town.

We hope you'll bepassing these new welcome signs very soon.

Peter Lewis Walkway, Cummins


On March 29, 1996 the walkway between the Junior Primary Classrooms and the School-Community Library was named and dedicated to the memory of former Cummins Area School Student Peter Lewis who was killed in action on May 13, 1968 at FSB Coral, Bien Hoa Province, Vietnam.


Peter joined the Army at about 19 years of age following a few years working for the stock firm Goldsbrough Mort in Cummins, Minnipa & Kimba. Peter enjoyed army life rising quickly through the ranks to Sergeant, with his first overseas service in Sarawak, Borneo before later volunteering to join the advance team for the Third Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment, which served its first tour of duty in Vietnam from December 1967 to 1968.

After leading his D Platoon, C Company on a number of missions around the Australian Army base at Nui Dat in Phuoc Tuy province, South Vietnam, Peter joined members of the units of the 1st Australian Task Force engaged in establishing Fire Support bases at Coral and Balmoral, north east of Saigon (Ho Chi Minh City).

While working with his commanding officer, Lieutenant Mark John to protect the area with Claymore mines, they were fired upon by a Viet Cong sniper. Despite the bravery and skills of a helicopter pilot, Peter died of wounds several hours later.

A Memorial Stone & Plaque and large portrait of Peter, painted by some of the Cummins Area School Art Students marked the walkway and Mr Mark John M.C. attended the ceremony from Canberra, Mr John was Peter's platoon commander in Vietnam.

In 2011, the a new building to house the C.A.S. Community Library was opened, however the memorial stone, plaque and portrait of Peter remained at the old location within the school grounds.

After a few years of planning, a new Peter Lewis Walkway was designed and built during 2019-2020 on the southern side of the new Library complex featuring the Memorial Plaque, a large glass etched portrait of Peter, a garden with stepping stones, the Ode on the pump-shed cover, rusted metal murals and a great wooden bench seat to rest weary bones on.

The area will continue to be added to over the coming years, with plans to include the names of all Cummins Area School Students who served in the Australian Defence Force since 1946.

Students and visitors to the Library are encouraged to visit the area and use it as a place of reflection.

On November 11, 2020 following the Remembrance Day Service, several Members of the Cummins-Yeelanna RSL Sub-branch, a representative of the CAS Library Staff and Peter's sister, Mrs Liz Blacker and her husband Bob, gathered to reflect on Peter's Service and Sacrifice. A formal dedication will be held in 2021.

Cummins-Yeelanna RSL Sub-branch would like to thank all involved in this project to make it possible.

Thank you to **VeteransSA** for the \$4,000 grant used to purchased and erect the glass etched portrait of Peter, The Lewis Family for the seat, Cummins Op Shop for the poppies, Geoff 'Fox' and Wendy Holman for organising it all and the 'Bugle Soldier' and Cummins Area School Staff & Students and Library Staff, Barb, Jeanie, Jenny & Robyn.

National Road Safety Week

Media Release – 16 November 2020 Council urges locals to 'Drive So Others Survive', this harvest season as part of National Road Safety Week.

National Road Safety Week, from November 15-22, highlights the impact of road trauma and ways to reduce it. Mayor Jo-Anne Quigley said it was important people were responsible on the road – avoid distractions like phones, never drive under the influence and stick to the speed limit.

"Our small communities spend a lot of time on the road, and it is up to each of us to ensure we drive safely, and to road and weather conditions," Mayor Quigley said.

"If we look out for each other we can all get home safe."

Harvest has started across Lower Eyre Peninsula and Council is asking people to be vigilant to ensure the safety of all road users and pedestrians.

Council has again successfully requested a temporary speed reduction from 50 kilometres an hour to 40kmh on Bruce Terrace in Cummins during the harvest period.

Council is also pleased shoulder widening works have been carried out on the Tod Highway in recent weeks, making some sections safer for drivers with increased grain freight on the road due to the closure of the railway.

"This is our second harvest with increased trucks on the road due to the rail closure and we are encouraging all road users to make safe decisions," Mayor Quigley said.
