Changes to budget consultation due to recycling trial

Due to changes made to the Draft 2021/22 Budget at the Ordinary Council Meeting on June 18, public consultation dates have been altered.

Council is proposing to undertake a fortnightly kerbside recycling collection trial in Boston, Coffin Bay, Cummins, Louth Bay, North Shields, Poonindie, Tiatukia, & Tulka to commence as soon as practicable in the 2021/22 financial year.

A service charge of \$150 - \$180 to residents within those townships is anticipated to cover the cost of the trial kerbside recycling collection service.

Submissions on the draft budget will now close at 5pm on Wednesday, July 14 for Council to consider all submissions at the Ordinary Council Meeting on July 16. Council expect to adopt the 2021/22 Annual Business Plan & Budget at a Special Council Meeting on July 30.

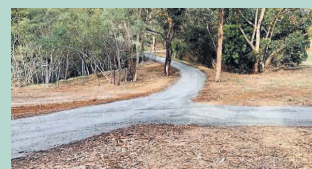
Long Term Financial Plan & Asset Management Plan

Morgan Reserve improvements

Coffin Bay's Morgan Reserve is set to get a \$80,000 facelift. There are plans to use the funds to install SA Water infrastructure for oval watering, and to keep a store of top soil to improve the surface and health of the oval. New playground equipment and soft-fall will also be installed.



Walking trail for Poonindie Reserve

Staff have completed a walking trail in the Poonindie Reserve. Unfortunately a member of the public has since driven through the trail causing some damage, and as a result bollards will be installed to prevent similar vehicle access.



New stairs for Louth Bay

Council's Teams have built a set of stairs leading to the Louth Bay jetty. The project also includes landscaping, a disabled access pathway and an osprey nest.

Grant for Flinders Highway

Council has been successful in a grant application to improve Flinders Highway from the Port Lincoln Golf Club entrance to Wine Shanty Road, including the Pound Lane intersection.

Council will receive \$918,250 – about half the total cost – through the State Government's Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Program. Work is expected to start in coming months.

Consultation sessions on Coffin Bay Master Plan

Council has endorsed a draft Coffin Bay Master Plan and it will be presented to community members by consultants Future Urban and City Collective at two public consultation sessions in Coffin Bay on Monday, July 5.

People can go along to the Coffin Bay Yacht Club to hear about the draft plan and provide feedback at 4pm or 6pm.

The draft plan proposes land use designations and future development areas, concepts aimed at enhanced community liveability, improved tourist management and ongoing protection of the environment.

Security screening to start from July 1

Security screening equipment has been installed at the Port Lincoln Airport. The new screening equipment includes checked and carry on baggage screening and new body scan technology which will bring Port Lincoln Airport in line with metro airports. The new Federal Government regulations requiring screening come into effect at Port Lincoln Airport on July 1 2021.
