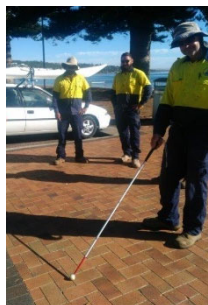


## COUNCIL NEWS

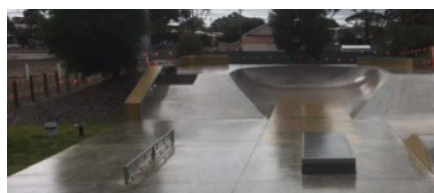
### Staff training

Maintenance Staff have completed Tactile Ground Surface Indicator training with the guidance of an Orientation & Mobility Instructor with Guide Dogs SA/NT. A tactile is a system of textured ground surface found on footpaths and stairs to warn pedestrians who are visually impaired of an approaching roadway or stairwell.



### Coffin Bay viewing deck progress

The replacement of the Upper Viewing Deck in Coffin Bay is almost complete by the Southern Maintenance team. Timber was found to be rotting in various places so this replacement was scheduled to ensure the safety and enjoyment of the area for residents and visitors alike.



### Skate Park reseal

The Cummins skate park's surface has been resealed by the Northern Maintenance Team. This reseal is an annual maintenance requirement to maximise the safety, function and enjoyment of the space for users and the broader community and ensures the facility remains a valuable public asset.
